

## **GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE TWO-SEMESTER PREPARATORY ROMANIAN LANGUAGE PROGRAMME (60 ECTS CREDITS) FOR FOREIGN CITIZENS**

The Romanian Language Programme for Foreign Citizens (Preparatory Year) is organized within the Department of Letters and Foreign Languages of the Faculty of Social, Humanistic and Natural Sciences at Hyperion University of Bucharest. Its **primary objective** is *the development of Romanian language communication competences necessary for the academic and socio-cultural integration of international students.*

The programme has been designed to meet the contemporary requirements of higher education by providing intensive linguistic training complemented by elements of Romanian culture and civilization. It facilitates international students' access to undergraduate, master's, and doctoral programmes conducted in Romanian.

The educational process is student-centered and combines modern teaching methodologies with interactive learning activities aimed at developing comprehension, oral and written communication skills, as well as the ability to adapt to the Romanian academic environment. Courses are delivered by academic staff specialized in philology and in the teaching of Romanian as a foreign language.

In addition to formal teaching activities, the programme includes initiatives intended to support students' cultural integration, such as thematic workshops, extracurricular activities, and intercultural events. In this way, the Preparatory Year contributes to the development of a solid academic profile and of the competences necessary for future university studies.

Through this programme, the Department of Letters and Foreign Languages reaffirms its role as a promoter of intercultural dialogue and academic excellence, offering international students a modern educational framework adapted to the demands of an increasingly globalized society.

### **1. Structure and Organization of the Programme**

The Preparatory Year Programme is conducted over the course of one academic year and is structured into two semesters:

- **Semester I:** October – February
- **Semester II:** February – June
